In the society 2, you are allocated 80,000 VND. In contrast to the society 1, however, both a person A and B are also allocated 80,000 VND in this society 2. This society is endowed with 240,000 VND in total.

In the society 3, you are allocated 100,000 VND. On the other hand, a person A is allocated 110,000 VND, whereas a person B is allocated 90,000 VND. This society is endowed with 300,000 VND in total.
